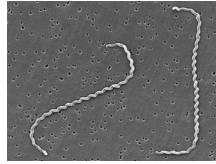

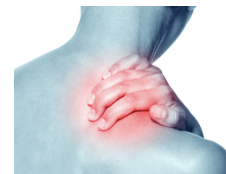

Signs & Symptoms

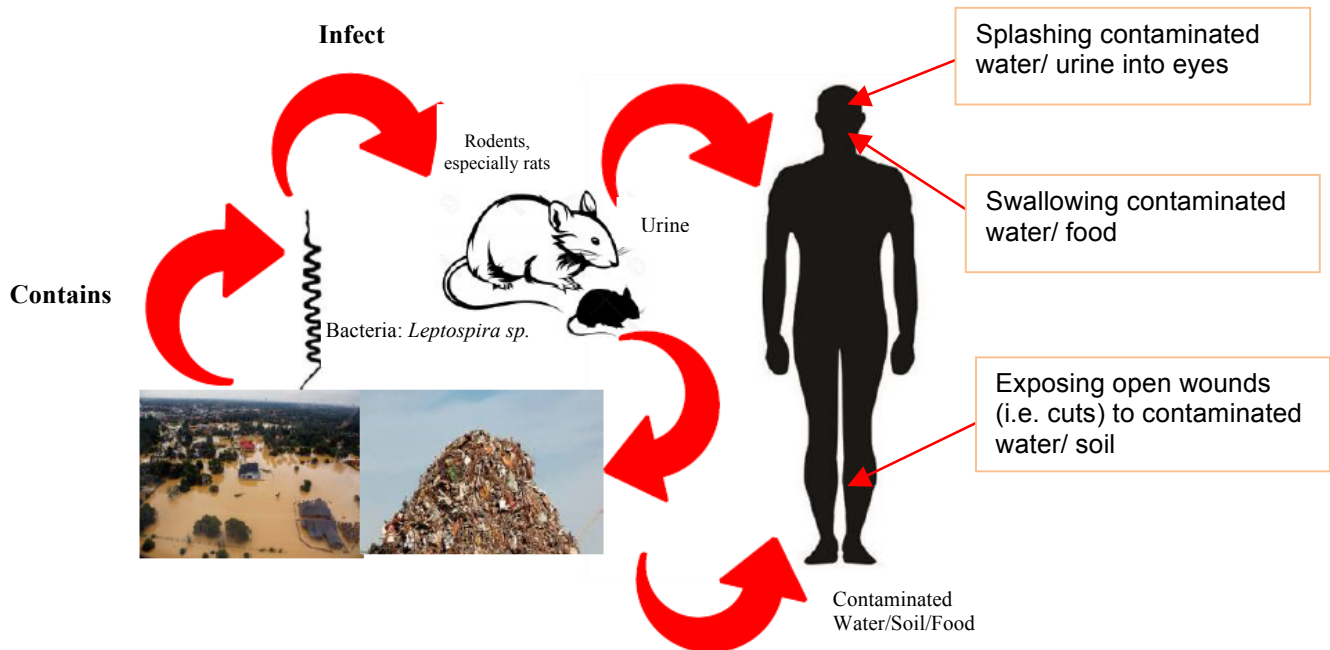
- High fever

- Dark-colored urine
- Low urine output



What is Leptospirosis?

A bacterial disease that is transmitted directly or indirectly from animals to humans. Rats and mice are the most important sources. Wild animals such as rodents, mongooses, pigs, cattle, livestock and dogs can also transmit the disease. Leptospira bacteria can live for long periods in fresh water and mud.

Mode of Transmission



High Risk Groups

- Workers in the agricultural sectors
- Sewerage workers
- Livestock handlers
- Pet shops workers
- Military personnel
- Search and rescue workers in high risk environment
- Disaster relief workers (e.g. during floods)
- People involved with outdoor / recreational activities
- Travelers who are not previously exposed to the bacteria in their environment
- People with chronic disease and open skin wounds

How to avoid getting Leptospirosis?

- Avoid swimming in potentially contaminated water or floodwater
- Use proper protection when exposed to contaminated water and soil
- Treat stream water and catchment water
- Control rodents and wildlife
- Vaccinate pets and farm animals
- Drain standing water
